If you are planning to visit the Washington, D.C. area, please contact Mike's office as soon as you book your trip. The office can arrange tours of the U.S. Capitol Building and the White House.

You may also download a form to be mailed or faxed to my Washington, D.C. office. Please be advised that White House Tours can take up to 6 months to schedule so please contact the office as soon as travel dates are known.
