

Maine Defense Stimulus Projects Announced

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According to the administration, the \$5.9 billion budget for these construction and repair projects represents the bulk of the approximately \$7.4 billion in defense-related funding provided by the ARRA. The primary purpose of these funds is to create jobs and stimulate economic activity across the country. All projects focus on making much-needed improvements to military installations and include hospitals, child development centers, and housing for troops and their families.

- Roof and Window Repairs, Training Facility Building 170 – \$4,765,000
