

Michaud Applauds Approval of TAA Eligibility for Pattison Sign Workers

WASHINGTON, DC – Today, Congressman Mike Michaud praised the announcement of the U.S. Department of Labor that all Pattison Sign Group workers in Limestone, Maine affected by the layoff in late March are now eligible to apply for Trade Adjustment Assistance. Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA) is a Department of Labor program that helps workers who have lost their jobs as a result of increased imports or a shift of production outside of the United States. TAA provides trade-affected workers with a variety of reemployment services and benefits to help them find new jobs and get back to work.
